

Rules and Regulations

Full costume (hat, mask and tunic) must be worn at all times

No getting off the float during the parade (unless instructed)

Must wear harness at all times

No smoking on the float

No cell phone use during parade (not in viewable area)

No Nails, Hooks or Screws

No altering, tampering or damaging the props on the float

No behavior that is indecent or vulgar

No consumption of alcohol in viewable area

No music that is not acceptable for public airwaves

No sitting or standing on ledge or railing of float

No standing on anything but deck of the float

No sexually indecent dress or characterization

No discarding of trash along the parade route

No throwing in the formation and disbanding area

No throwing during escort to the formation area

Prohibited Throws

No bomb bags or Sprays

No flowers with wire stems

No exploding, detonating, or life threatening items

No noxious substance or liquid



No stink bombs or stink sprays

No wood, plastic or bamboo spears/tomahawk

No silly string

No sexually oriented devices, beads, condoms or prophylactic

No items that communicates any commercial, promotional, ads, political or religious message

No distributing alcoholic beverages, shooters or shots to any spectators

No unauthorized use of Krewe logo or name

No copyrighted or trademarked logo or names

Prohibited on Float

No boxes (plastic or cardboard)

No Nails, Spikes or Screws

No laser pointers

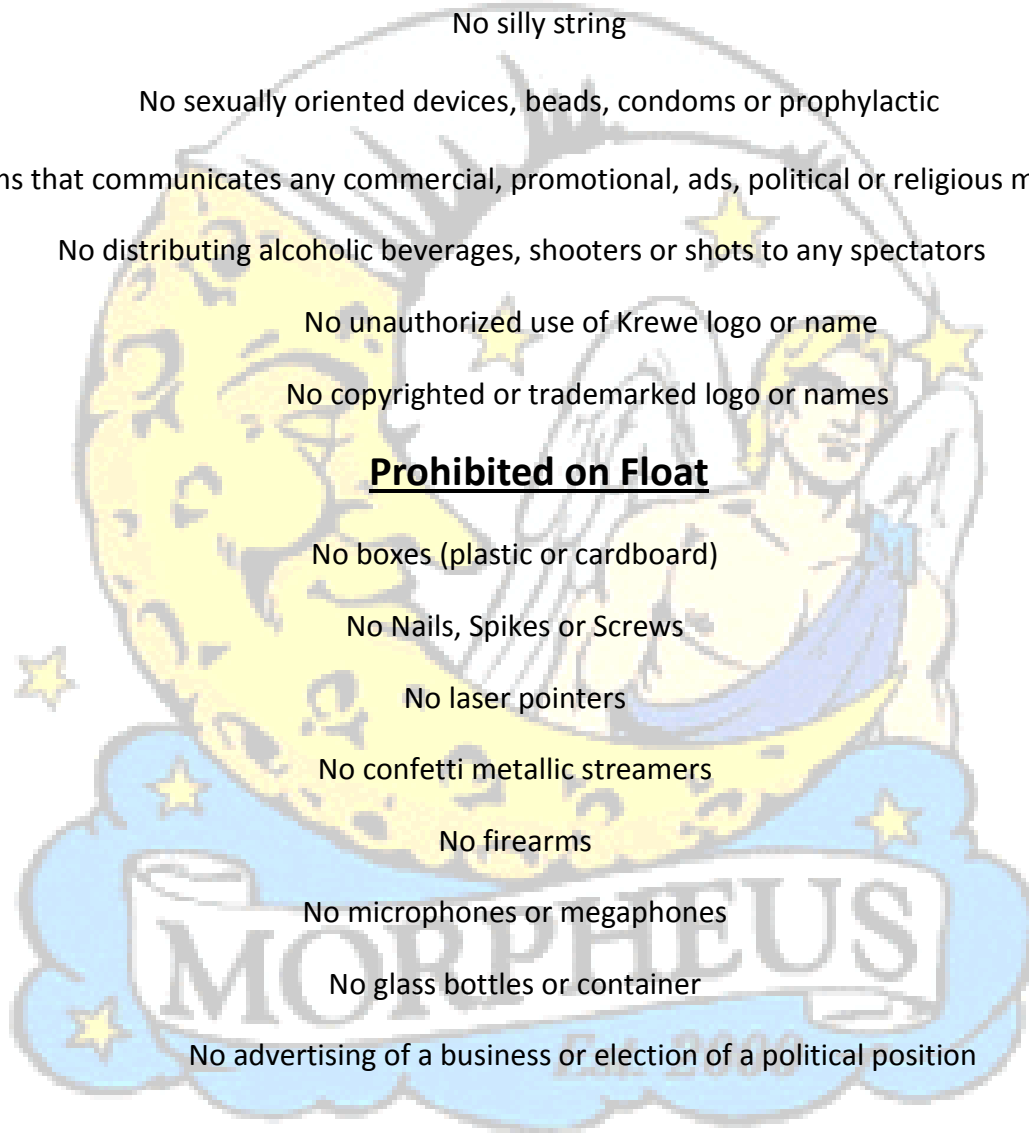
No confetti metallic streamers

No firearms

No microphones or megaphones

No glass bottles or container

No advertising of a business or election of a political position



The Board of Directors, Float Lieutenant, Parade Marshall, New Orleans Police, New Orleans Fire and Department of Safety & Permits is authorized to remove any person that is in violation of any provisions listed. New Orleans Police and Fire as well as the Department of Safety & Permits can and will issue citations for any violation. If any individual willfully violates any of the provisions, the individual maybe punished by fine and/or imprisonment as allowable by law. Any violation can be subject to a \$500.00 fine per violation. Other penalties include suspension and/or membership termination.
